Individuals with social learning challenges (ASD, ADHD, and other behavioral difficulties) may find social skills incredibly complicated. Age appropriate social skills facilitate interactions and communication with others both verbally and nonverbally. *Social Skills for Teenagers with Developmental and Autism Spectrum Disorders: The PEERS Treatment Manual* is a treatment framework developed by Dr. Elizabeth Laugeson that teaches teens appropriate social and communication skills in today's world. Taught by professional Speech Therapist, local School Counselor and counseling staff.

- Conversations
- Electronic Communication
- Handling Bullying
- Friendships
- Conflicts
- Handling put downs, teasing and embarrassment
- Sportsmanship
- Reputations
